Independent Audit of Impact Cleaning Services Sites called for by SEIU

Property owners and managers contacted amid concerns of violation of workers' rights

Toronto – The Service Employees International Union Local 2 (SEIU) have contacted property managers and owners to request they cooperate in an independent audit of the employment standards in buildings where they have contracted work to Impact Cleaning Services Limited (Impact).

SEIU is proposing that the audit be conducted by the Workers Action Centre (WAC). WAC is a community-based advocacy group that works with people in low-wage and unstable employment and is completely independent of SEIU.

A complaint was filed with the Ministry of Labour on behalf of employees of Impact two weeks ago alleging that many of contractor's employees in Toronto are being paid less than the minimum wage and are working without WSIB, EI or CPP benefits.

SEIU has given property managers and owners to the end of the month to respond.
